From the Chief's Desk ~ Fire Chief Jack Carriger

When it rains it pours . . . even in July! Much like the weather the last few days the District has had good things falling on it also. Recently the board passed the 2016-2017 FY budget and I am pleased to say we were able to include several purchases that will enhance our service delivery and training.

Due to our reserve funds and good financial planning, we were able to purchase all new battery-powered extrication tools which will allow us to deal effectively with the metals in new vehicles. The tools have been ordered and should be here around the end of August.

Thanks to the training committee and their development of a three-year strategic plan, the training facility will see great improvements. Thanks to all that have been dedicating their time to these projects.

The Board will be awarding the contract for the Seismic Rehab Grant at the July board meeting. This will allow us to move forward with the cost analysis and the application for the grants. We will apply for grants for all four stations.

We received word last week that we were awarded the AFG Grant for an exhaust extraction system at station 80 so we will be moving forward with that project as well.

All-in-all, this is great news for the District but it also means a great deal of work over the next two years so be prepared for a lot of construction around the District.







FIRE ACADEMY students received hands-on training on the Burn to Learn on June 4. The old dentist office / future home of Maps Credit Union on Fern Ridge, was used for training for new fire recruits from districts throughout the Santiam Canyon.

Buildings donated for Burn to Learns are used for several weeks for training before they are eventually burned down. Students learn fire behavior and fire fighting skills that will help them when called upon to respond to the real thing.

FACILITIES UPDATE

There is a lot of ongoing facilities projects that we are working on in the district. First, Chief and I are working on a grant for seismic upgrades for all stations. We are currently seeking bids for structural analysis to get an idea of what improvements might need to be made. This is the first step in the process before moving forward and applying for the grant.

We are also working with our electrician and the Energy Trust of Oregon regarding some lighting upgrades in the District. We have had an initial walk through and are now developing a plan which will then be submitted to the Energy Trust for evaluation to see how much of the project will be covered by the Energy Trust.

The Training Facility Committee has developed a long term plan for the facility. We are in the process of removing the roof prop and are going to separate the search room containers to pour new footings that will allow us to add a second story in the future.

Lastly, we have a few upgrades in the district. We have purchased and installed a new range and hood in the kitchen at Station 80 and a new treadmill at Station 82.
