As we draw near to the end of another fiscal

year, I'm happy to report that the District has had a good year financially. We have exceeded our projected income and are under our projected spending for the year. The number of conflagrations we sent apparatus on assisted in the increase on the revenue side but the real contributor was all of you and your efforts in conserving funds, spending when it was necessary and saving when you could. Everyone's commitment to our financial plan over the years has made us very stable and allowed us to have the reserve funds in place when we do need to make purchases.

As we work through the budget process for 2016-2017 we are assessing the needs for the

coming years as well as looking several years down the road at future needs. Our most immediate need is to replace our aging extrication tools. The Rescue Tool Committee has met several times, analyzed our needs, and formulated a plan with several options for purchasing new tools. As we finalize the budget we will select a replacement option that matches our resources and move forward with the purchase when its decided which tools to purchase. This will be a significant upgrade to our tools and allow us to operate more efficiently on the metals we are confronted with in new cars.

Again I would like to thank all of you for your commitment to maintaining a sound financial plan that serves the needs of the District and respects the value of tax dollars our community entrust us with.

## Congratulations! 232 Years of Service!

Several firefighters from Stayton recently participated in recent Stairclimb challenges. They were the Seattle Stairclimb sponsored by Scott Airpacks, benefitting the Leukemia Lymphoma Society and the Calgary Stairclimb in Canada which benefits the Wellspring Calgary Cancer Research Institute.

The Seattle Stairclimb is held at the Columbia Tower in downtown Seattle and contains 1311 steps to the top. What makes this climb especially difficult is that climbers are wearing all of their firefighting gear (PPE) and are "on air" which means they are masked up and using the air from their bottles. Stay-

ton Fire participants were Brennan Baker, Byron Brown, and Will Comerford.

The Calgary Stairclimb is held at the Bow Tower in downtown Calgary Canada and contains 1204 steps to the top. Firefighters wear full gear and packs for this climb, but are not breathing the bottled air. The challenge from this climb is the elevation of over 7000 feet to get to the top.

In only its second year, this climb is rapidly becoming one of the more popular climbs available. Stayton Fire participants were Matt Aalto and Scott Orr.
