

Stay Safe When a WINTER STORM Threatens



- * Pay attention to weather reports and warnings of freezing weather and winter storms.
- Gather supplies in case you need to stay home for several days without power. Keep in mind each person's specific needs, including medications. Do not forget the needs of pets. Have extra batteries for radios and flashlights.
- * Create an emergency supply kit for your car. Include jumper cables, sand, a flashlight, warm clothes, blankets, bottled water, and non-perishable snacks.
- * Keep the gas tank full.
- * Avoid carbon monoxide poisoning. Only use generators and grills outdoors and away from windows.
- * Never heat your home with a gas stovetop or oven.
- * Check on your neighbors.

Fire Investigation Class / Drill ~ AC Jay Alley

During the week of January 9 thru 12, the Stayton Fire District hosted a Basic Fire Investigation Course sponsored by Marion/Polk Fire Investigation Team (MPFIT).

The first couple of days were spent prepping the structures for Friday when Stayton, Aumsville and Sublimity crews did the burn sets.

The class was held on Saturday and Sunday with a cadre of instructors from OSFM, OSP, Marion DA office, Stayton Fire District, Aurora Fire District, Keizer Fire District, and Lincoln County Fire Investigation Team member.

There were 26 Students in class, with a mix of law and fire agencies. The students spent the weekend learning basic fire investigation techniques, investigating the sets and preparing a report.
