

New Turnout Racks at Stations 80 and 82

We recently installed new wall-mount turnout racks at Stayton Station 80 and Mehama Station 82. The new racks are bigger than our existing racks and have adjustable shelves, a hanger bar, and garment hooks.

They will provide more space for each firefighter's gear and allow for easier cleaning of the apparatus bay floors. We had good participation for the work parties and we were able to complete the installation and move all the gear in just a few hours.

Cooking Fire Safety

Each year, hundreds of fires are sparked in Oregon by cooking, many of which can be avoided with proper fire safety.

Whether you are cooking a holiday dinner or a snack for children, practicing safe cooking behaviors will help keep you and your family safe. Keep the simple actions below in mind every time you step into the kitchen to cook.

- Keep an eye on what you're cooking; don't leave cooking unattended.
- Keep your cooking areas clean and clear of combustibles (potholders, food packaging, towels, etc.) and wipe up surface spills.
- Create a three-foot kid- and pet-free zone around the stove.
- Older children should only cook with permission and under the supervision of an adult.
 Have a lid or cookie sheet within reach while cooking (to smother flames) in case of a fire.

What to do if a Fire Sparks

- Put a lid on it! Slide a lid over the pan (from the side) and then turn off the burner.
- Don't move the pan until the fire is completely extinguished and cooled; don't try transferring the pan to the sink.

If You Cannot Extinguish the Fire

- Get you and your family safely out of the house.
- If you can, close doors as you escape to help contain the fire.
- Call 911 from a safe place (outside).
- Let firefighters know if everyone is out of the building.





HOLIDAY SAFETY

- Make sure your smoke alarms are working
- Do not overload electrical outlets
- Use battery operated candles
- Check decorations for certification label
- Keep combustibles at least 3 feet away from heat sources
- Never leave a source of fire or heat unattended
- Never use charcoal or propane devices indoors
- Water tree daily
- Turn off, unplug & extinguish all decorations when leaving the house or going to sleep
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking
- Close your doors when sleeping

VFA Grant

The District received an VFA grant in the amount of \$7,553 to assist in purchasing new fire shelters and drip torches.

This grant provides half the funding to replace 26 outdated fire shelters and 2 new drip torches. The order has been placed through Cascade Fire Equipment.

Fire Act Grant for SCBA Purchase

The district was awarded a 2022 Assistance to Firefighters grant in the amount of \$396,440 to purchase new SCBA.

The District evaluated MSA, SCOTT, and Drager models. After initial testing, manufacturer presentations and committee evaluations, the SCBA committee has recommended that we purchase the MSA SCBAs.

Chief Alley and AC Kintz met with LN Curtis to discuss final details for the order. On October 30th, the order was placed for 40-MSA G1 SCBA 80-4500 psi 45-minute low profile cylinders, 46-G1 masks, and

2-MSA G1 RIT packs with 60-minute cylinders.

In addition, we also purchased and received a new Quantifit 2 fit test machine on the grant. We should receive the packs within 4-6 months.

We still need to purchase battery bank chargers, spare batteries, and fill station adaptors.

Thank you to Laura Houston for all her hard work on the grant, the SCBA committee members for their time and careful consideration and all the firefighters who participated in the testing process.

This purchase will bring the district up to current NFPA standards for SCBA and last us well into the future.
